... is founding member of the "Conference of European **Cross-border and Interregional City Networks**" (CECICN)

This conference of six cross-border and interregional city networks* brings together more than 500 cities at internal and external borders of the European Union. It aims at exchanging good practices and representing interests of its members, in terms of cross-border and interregional cooperation involving cities.

... has formed a strategic alliance with the Association of European Border **Regions (AEBR)**

This alliance, formed in 2007, enables to cover all levels of cross-border cooperation, among them the regional level.

... makes its voice heard at European level through its position statements

These position statements cover topics including the future of the cohesion policy, territorial cohesion and multilevel governance, the EGTC and the implementation of European territorial cooperation programmes.

...is in close contact with the European institutions

Relations with the European Commission. the Committee of the Regions (declaration of common interest), the European Parliament and the Council of Europe enable regular communication on current topics in cross-border cooperation.

... has published a manifesto for crossborder cooperation in Europe

This document presents twelve sets of recommendations on major thematic of cross-border cooperation in Europe. It is designed for local, regional, national, and European authorities.
