Context

In the face of the crises that we have been dealing with for the past 20 years, should we resign ourselves to a situation where countries turn in on themselves and borders are reduced to mere dividing lines? Or are we capable collectively of demonstrating resilience, of adapting to an uncertain world, and of regarding borders as shared territories that are sources of progress?

Although they have been in the spotlight over the past two years and have been profoundly impacted by the pandemic, cross-border territories are conspicuously absent from the recovery plans. However, they can clearly be the leading territories for experimentation and innovation to meet the ambitions of the European Green Deal and embody Europe of the limits should once again call into question our ecological transition.

Objectives of the Borders Forum

1. Demonstrate the key role played by cross**border areas** in bringing the peoples of Europe together; promote sustainable and inclusive growth; and support European integration.

2. Convince European and national authorities to put cross-border territories at the heart of their public action.

3. Showcase France's ambitions for crossborder territories at the European level in the framework of the French Presidency of the Council of the European Union.

Cross-border areas involve **30%** of the European population. Two million European workers are cross-border workers.

Main organiser

The Mission Opérationnelle Transfrontalière (MOT) is the result of a long-term partnership between the cross-border territories and the national and European institutions. Working alongside its members, partners and European networks, the MOT is heavily involved in crossborder policies at these three levels.

The 2nd Borders Forum is supported by the French National Agency for Territorial Cohesion.

European partners

The European Commission published in summer 2021 a report setting out its priorities for border regions, which are key tools for European integration. It suggests that these territories should be better taken into account in EU Cohesion policy 2021-2027.

The European Committee of the Regions is one of the main promoters of territorial cooperation and of the 80 European Groupings for Territorial Cooperation (EGTCs). The CoR support the day-to-day work of cross-border territories and networks in Europe.

ESPON is an EU-funded programme which aims at promoting and fostering a European territorial dimension in development and cooperation by providing evidence, knowledge transfer and policy learning to public authorities and other policy actors at all level.
